Emergency Plans, First Aid Kits, Natural and Manmade Disasters

Classroom activities:

- 1) Vocabulary is large I hope they can do 20 words in a test
 - a. As a spelling Bee (a spelling bee is a spelling competition. People either compete as individuals, or as teams. I usually do boys v. girls. Rules I USE (but you can change)... everyone has to answer at least 1 question.... One person can't answer all the questions... they can come up with answers as a TEAM, but there has to be a different 'announcer' of the word/spelling... each right word gets one point.... Total points wins... and then give them a prize like 20 minutes more of recess or something.... Be creative there are few rules... goal: competitive spelling in a fun and rewarding way
 - b. Do 10 words the first day, 10 the second and all the third. Test on the fifth day
- 2) Have them memorize the differences between the 2 types of disasters and have them write a "35 word essay".
- 3) Have each one give a 4 minute 'speech' on how they will protect their family in a disaster
- 4) Have the kids create an actual disaster kit
- 5) Concept: Prepare for the two types. Preparation for a man-made and natural disaster are pretty much the same you can do ½ one day and the other half another play with it point is, over 3 days, its covered
- 6) As a class, read the handout of choice and discuss
