The world's most dangerous Triangle - Jordan, Iran and North Korea

In the 60's, America aired the Twilight Zone. Hosted by Rod Serling, its opening credits started by saying....

"There is a fifth dimension beyond that which is known to man. It is a dimension as vast as space and as timeless as infinity. It is the middle ground between light and shadow, between science and superstition, and it lies between the pit of man's fears and the summit of his knowledge. This is the dimension of imagination. It is an area which we call the Twilight Zone"

INTRODUCTION

A couple of days ago I woke up and read that N. Korea had conducted another nuclear test – this one a Hydrogen bomb. This scary event raises an important question: Where is the money coming from to conduct the tests and build a Hydrogen Bomb that threatens the world like an eerie Twilight Zone episode?

Recently, Reuters reported on a secret UN report that should scare world leaders to the coreit states that N. Korea has been shipping chemical weapons to Syria, violating sanctions (1).

I see the development of a deadly new 'nuclear terror triangle' (NTT) being created consisting of the King of Jordan, Iran and N. Korea.

NUCLEAR AMBITIONS:

These three "NTT" countries have scared world leaders with violent threats since Jan. 2017. These nuclear wannabes have:

- Sold brokered weapons: The world knows that Iran is firmly on Assad's side, while
 media reports have confirmed that Jordan's king sends water, assistance and weapons
 to Assad, while helping him with his "banking". Now N. Korea has been caught sending
 him chemical weapons.
- 'Nuclear ambitions': Iran wants the bomb and nuclear power, while Jordan's king wants nuclear energy for his country (2). After the hydrogen blast, N. Korea's ambitions are clear.
- Threatened lives and peace: N. Korea, Jordan and Iran have repeatedly threatened the west. N. Korea and Iran chant "Death to America and Israel" daily, while Jordan says that if America abandons the two state solution or moves its embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem, he will promote and finance a 3rd Intifada.

Based on the Reuters article, N. Korea's actions beg three questions:

- Who paid for the weapons?
- How did the chemical weapons arrive in the Middle East?
- What role did the King of Jordan play?

INTERNATIONAL TIES JORDAN & IRAN

For years, the west has known about the growing connections between Iran and terrorism, but less is known about the confusing ties between Iran and Jordan (3). The world also knows that both countries fund terrorists like the Muslim Brotherhood (MB) and Hamas, as well as support the martyrdom program that pays terrorists for killing Jews. The real question here is this: no matter how they feel about each other, are both countries working with N. Korea, and if so, what role are they playing in developing their nuclear program (4)?

IRAN AND N. KOREA

Iran and N. Korea have pledged cooperation with each other, especially in the development of nuclear programs (5).

JORDAN AND N. KOREA

Relations between the two are not clear. On one hand, you'd think that the Western leading King would stay away from them, but with his regime crumbling under a 94% debt ratio, these secretive countries appear to 'have enough in common' to undertake a business venture or two.

COMMONALITIES

Other 'NTT" connections are:

- 1) **SHORT**: All three are short the king is 5'5" (6), while Iran's Rouhani is 5'7" (7). Jong-un is 5'7" (8). Based on psychological profiles, they all exhibit the '**Napoleon Complex**'. Named after Bonaparte (5'6") (9), the **Complex** affects short people, and is characterized by overly-aggressive or domineering social behavior, implying that it's compensatory for the subject's stature;
- 2) **EDUCATED**: All are Western-educated– Jung in Switzerland, while Jordan's king and Rouhani were educated in the UK;
- CONSTITUTIONAL POWERS: Their Constitutions place them 'above the Rule of Law', making them immune from prosecution;
- 4) **RIGHTS**: All have documented questionable civil and human rights records by international organizations;
- 5) **CONFLICTING IMAGES**: All are secretive, and project varied images at home and abroad. Jung-Un is the most secretive (confusion includes his birthdate, age and education);
- 6) ANTI-ISRAEL AND WEST: All are anti-Israel, anti-West;
- 7) **CENSORSHIP & TRANSPARENCY**: All provide zero transparency and support strict censorship, making it difficult to understand their motives, including how they earn or spend their money;
- 8) LAVISH: All leaders live lavish lifestyles, with multiple residences and plenty of food;
- 9) **INVESTMENTS**: Iran and Jordan's King have money to burn. Iran received \$150 billion from America, while the king's personal wealth is unknown;
- 10) **BUYING FRIENDS**: All parties need friends and trading partners. The King is losing international support and regional friends daily, while Iran and N. Korea's rogue regimes are trying to make them. In Jordan's case, the king is doing anything possible to "find

friends" that will keep his floundering dictatorship in power. With money to spend, he owns multiple alphabet corporations, so making a 'business deal' with N. Korea is not as farfetched as it sounds (selling missile technology and nuclear material can become a great income producing business);

- 11) **RUSSIA:** All have diplomatic ties with Russia. Russia and N. Korea established diplomatic relations in 1948 (12), which assumes that they are close "friends". Russia works closely with Iran in Syria and the King has met with Putin several times;
- 12) **CHINA**: Jordan and China have diplomatic relations (13), while China and Russia have relations (14). N. Korea has relations with both countries;
- 13)**TERRORISM**: These nations openly support terrorism and have a common enemy Israel. Jordan and Iran support the Muslim Brotherhood (MB) and other terrorists, so its not a stretch to think that N. Korea would develop ties with anyone who believes as they do, including the MB;

With commonalities aside, we now need answer to some questions:

- Where did the N. Korean sub carrying chemical weapons, dock?
- How were the intercepted chemicals supposed to get to Assad?
- And how was the king involved?

WHERE DID THE SUB DOCK?

After analyzing options, the only place the mini-sub could have docked was Jordan's Aqaba because Iran and Russia are two far away, Northern Syria is under siege and they could never get anything through Israel, Lebanon or Egypt.

So who helped? The obvious choice is either Jordan's military or the Muslim Brotherhood, under the direction of the king, could move the cargo to Damascus. Jordan did this before by selling weapons to ISIS. The question here is, did the king know? Like the sale of weapons to ISIS, nothing of this magnitude could ever happen in Jordan without the King's knowledge or assistance, and he probably profited from it, politically and financially.

CONCLUSION:

So where does this leave us? Iran has money to spend, and cares little about what America says. They openly promote terrorism, the overthrow of the US and death to Israel. They are working with Russia to support Assad and are prohibited from conducting nuclear experiments of any type. But, they are not prohibited from leasing land, hiring "employees", or investing in nuclear experiments conducted on someone else's property.

Jordan has money to invest and the king is preparing 'an exit strategy' for his failing regime. As such, he is buying friends and investing anywhere he can – waiting for a pay-off. With any luck, he will bring Jordan into the Nuclear power club and elevate his standing in the region.

S. Korea has cheap labor, lots of land, and needs investment capital to create and conduct their nuclear research programs. They also offer big payoffs to secret investors who want information, but have to stay at arm's length. They have become the perfect ABC Corporation.

What's sad is this: all have receive money from the USA to not do what they are doing. Iran received \$150 billion from President Obama to not be nuclear, while Jordan receives \$1.5 billion a year, without any restrictions at all. And sadly, Newsweek reported that Washington has paid Billions to N. Korea for over 25 years to not be nuclear (13).

Throughout history, stranger partnerships have developed, but none are as dangerous. Welcome to the NTT club – a product of the Twilight Zone.
